#### Yamaguchi University and Yamaguchi city

The roots of YU go back to 1815, with the founding of a school for the sons of local gentry. In 1949, it was refounded as one of the state universities of Japan. It currently has more than 10,000 enrolled students (undergraduate and graduate) at nine faculties. It is located at the western tip of Honshu in the cities of Yamaguchi and Ube. Surrounded by splendid nature, this region has a long tradition of international relations both with Asia and Europe: well-known are the pottery craftsmen from Korea, who developed the famous Hagi pottery, the missionary Xavier from Spain, who brought the first tidings from the Western world, and the Choshu-Five, five brave young men, who broke the ban

on foreign travel in the mid-19th century to study at London University. Today, the ultra-modern Yamaguchi Center for Arts and Media (YCAM) attracts young artists from all over the world.

Present-day Yamaguchi offers many opportunities for enjoying both nature and modern or traditional culture.

#### (1) Visa

A visa is unnecessary for students in countries in the Visa Waiver Program.

Students in countries that are not in the Visa Waiver Program should get a "Temporary Visitor Visa." Please prepare a "Certification of Acceptance" and a "Permit to Attend a Class", "Invitation Letter", "Program Schedule" and "Guarantee" which are issued by YU, and also other necessary documents (passport, financial certificate and so on), and then please apply to the Japanese Embassy or the Consulate. It may take a long time to issue a visa, so please remember that and apply as soon as possible. Regarding visa details, an applicant should inquire at the Japanese Embassy or the Consulate by himself/herself.

# (2) Travel to Japan

Participants should come to YU by themselves in principle. Please plan to arrive at YU by 3 p.m. on July 7, 2016.

#### (3) Insurance and Medical Care

During your stay in Japan, you must be enrolled in the Insurance scheme that YU introduced in cases of illness, injury, or accident. (Before coming to Japan, the Insurance does not cover such cases. Please be careful.) For some treatments and prescriptions, a high medical cost is temporally required, so please perform these special treatments such as dental care before visiting Japan.

#### (4) Others

- ❖ The voltage of Japan (Yamaguchi) is 100V and 60Hz, and the shape of the plug is type A. Please bring a transformer and a conversion plug if you need them.
- \* It is useful if you have a picture of your family or things particular to your country.
- ❖ It is very hot in July in Japan (25 $\sim$ 35 $^{\circ}$ C). You are comfortable in short-sleeved clothes. Sandals are useful if you have them.
