※ **Temple Stay**

Temple Stay is a cultural experience program designed to help people understand Korean Buddhism better. Students of DISS will have a great opportunity to stay in one of the historical temples in Korea. For one night, it offers various kinds of practicing methods such as Yebul(ceremonial service involving chanting), Chamseon(Zen meditation), Dahdoh(tea ceremony) and Balwoo Gongyang(communal Buddhist meal service). Participants can find their 'true self' amongst the harmony of nature while staying at a temple.
