The final paper (maximum 15,000 characters) must be submitted by 31st January, 2022. Selected conference papers will be published in a dedicated volume of Religious-Philosophical Articles (Reliģiski-filozofiski raksti, ISSN 1407-1908), a double-blind peer-reviewed periodical with an international editorial board. Editions of Religious-Philosophical Articles are available through the Central and Eastern European Online Library, CEEOL and also the EBSCO and SCOPUS databases.
